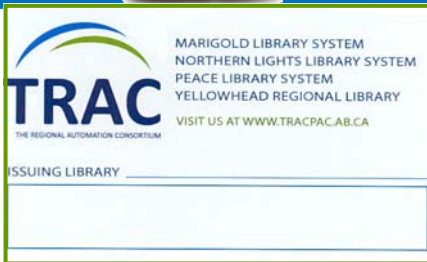


Search our e-resources

OverDrive



Allows library customers to browse, check out, and **download audiobooks and eBooks.** An Audiobook is a

book that you listen to. It's a recorded reading by a narrator or cast of actors, and can also be enjoyed on a computer or portable device. An eBook is a digital book, magazine, or graphic novel that can be read on a computer or portable device. Using OverDrive is easy. Business Source Elite

Full text for more than 1,100 scholarly business journals, including 500 peer-reviewed business publications. Presents information dating back to

1985 and detailed company profiles for the world's 10,000 largest companies. Includes **Regional Business News**, which is American regional newspapers and business magazines.

HISTORY AND GENEALOGY

Ancestry Library Edition

(in-library access only) More than 5 billion names in over 3,400 databases, and includes records from the United States census; military records; court, land, and probate records; vital and church records; directories; passenger lists. Contains similar information for United Kingdom, Canada and some European countries.

Heritage Quest Online

Images and extensive indexing from the 1790 - 1930 U.S. federal censuses. Offers more than 20,000 book titles, including nearly 8,000 family histories and over 12,000 local histories. There are more than 250 primary-source documents such as tax lists, city directories, probate records, and more.

E-RESOURCE GLOSSARY

Full text - the whole article has been stored within the database (e-resource), and you can retrieve it and print or e-mail the whole article.

Bibliographic reference - title, author, magazine / journal /book title, magazine volume and page number, publisher and publishing date.

Abstract - a brief summary of a magazine/ journal article.

Scholarly - articles authored by academics for a target audience that is mainly academic.

Peer reviewed - an article is said to be peer reviewed if it goes through an official editorial process that involves review and approval by the author's peers (people who are experts in the same subject area as the author). Most scholarly publications are peer reviewed.
