### Marigold staff settle into their new office space



September was an exciting and busy month:


- Marigold staff moved into the new building on September 24 and took part in training for various mechanical and electrical systems.
- Substantial completion was declared and accepted by our architects, BRZ Partnership Architecture on September 30.
- The Lyngsoe Automatic Sortation System was installed and our staff has been familiarizing themselves with the new equipment.
- MP Martin Shields, new Marigold Board members and a group of former Marigold employees visited Marigold's new headquarters for a tour. See Page 8 for photos.
- Marigold kept the project costs under the \$8 million cap set by the Marigold Board.
- The Executive Committee approved two new agreements in October: Insurance Coverage and Entitlement and the Interim Operating Agreement.
- A tentative date for the Grand Opening in June has been proposed and will be discussed with the Marigold/WID Joint Facility Committee and the Marigold Executive Committee.



#### What's next?...


- Marigold and the Western Irrigation District (WID) is completing the application and registration
  process for the formation of the condominium corporation that will ultimately be on title for the
  shared areas, with Marigold and the WID owning their own units.
- The Strathmore Fire Department has been onsite to ensure lockbox and fire panel keys are in place. Marigold has offered a tour of the facility to the fire department crew and intends to invite other first responders in the area to the facility.
- The WID completed as much work on the landscaping and planting as they could before the weather turned cold.

Throughout October, Marigold's shipping, receiving and delivery staff worked out of the old location until the Lyngsoe Automatic Sortation System arrived at the new facility. The equipment has been installed and training has been completed. Staff have noticed the improved ergonomics and workflow from the sortation system, and are able to complete sorting at a faster rate. Shipping and receiving staff have commented that between the ergonomic flooring and sortation system, there is noticeable improvement on their knees and feet at the end of the day.
