StoryWalk

StoryWalks are an excellent way to raise your libraries profile in your community. It creates family friendly literacy events that require very few library staff hours! I was excited to try out a story walk in Mini Thni (the town formally known as Morley) but the wind is a constant reality there and I could not think of a way to keep the pages in place.

In October of 2021 I saw an article in the Rotary Canada magazine about a project done by the Ladner Rotary Club in Delta BC. They created a series of three permanent story walk installations at parks in their community. I was inspired to approach my own club, the Rotary Club of Canmore to ask if this might be a project they would like to support in the neighboring community of Mini Thni.



A partnership was created between
Marigold Library System, Stoney
Education Authority, and the Rotary Club
of Canmore. We found an excellent site
along the running track by Nakoda
Elementary School and volunteers from
the Rotary club set about building
permanent platforms for displaying picture
books.

Marigold already had permission to use "Âba Wathech Înâ Makoche" by Sherry Shotclose so we were ready to go. If you want to use a picture book for a story walk, please check with your Marigold consultant about what permissions are needed.

Most of the work on our book displays was done by volunteers, including the installation, so it is hard to estimate a cost, but the original article says that their budget was \$2000.00. I think that this kind of project might be of interest to service clubs in any community. The cost is also low enough to be within reach of a fundraising event in even the smallest community.



I believe that the installation in Mini Thni will continue to offer opportunities for community engagement for many years to come.









Winter StoryWalks

IGM has only the most flexible of entry requirements – you have to have some sort of game-related activity in or around your library during the **month of November**. That's all! The games can be videogames on a library console, tabletop games, social games, party games, traditional folk games – whatever you think will work for your individual library and community.

Registration involves filling out a questionnaire about your library and your plans for the event, and then gives you information about the donation options available to your library. You can also sign up for some international inter-library events that will give your community the chance to connect to other library communities all over the world.

Promotional materials, including posters, logos, and press materials, are available to help you promote the event in your library. And there's a blog at https://games.ala.org which publishes updates weekly on a range of topics to help inspire ideas, discussion, and of course learning around games and play in libraries.











